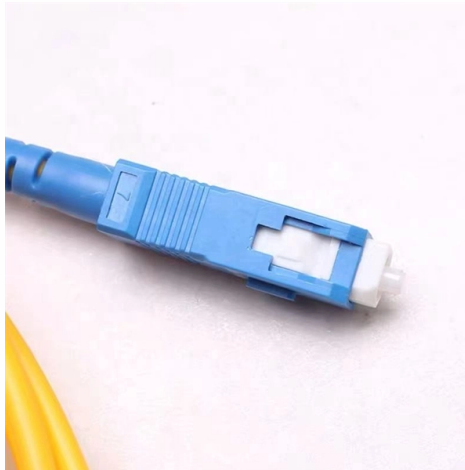


Core Switch Selection
