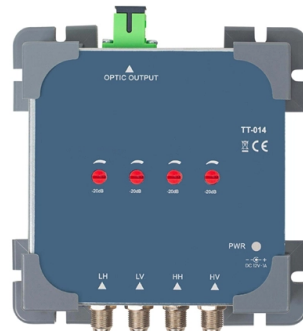


Requirements for cable bundling spacing inside cable trays
